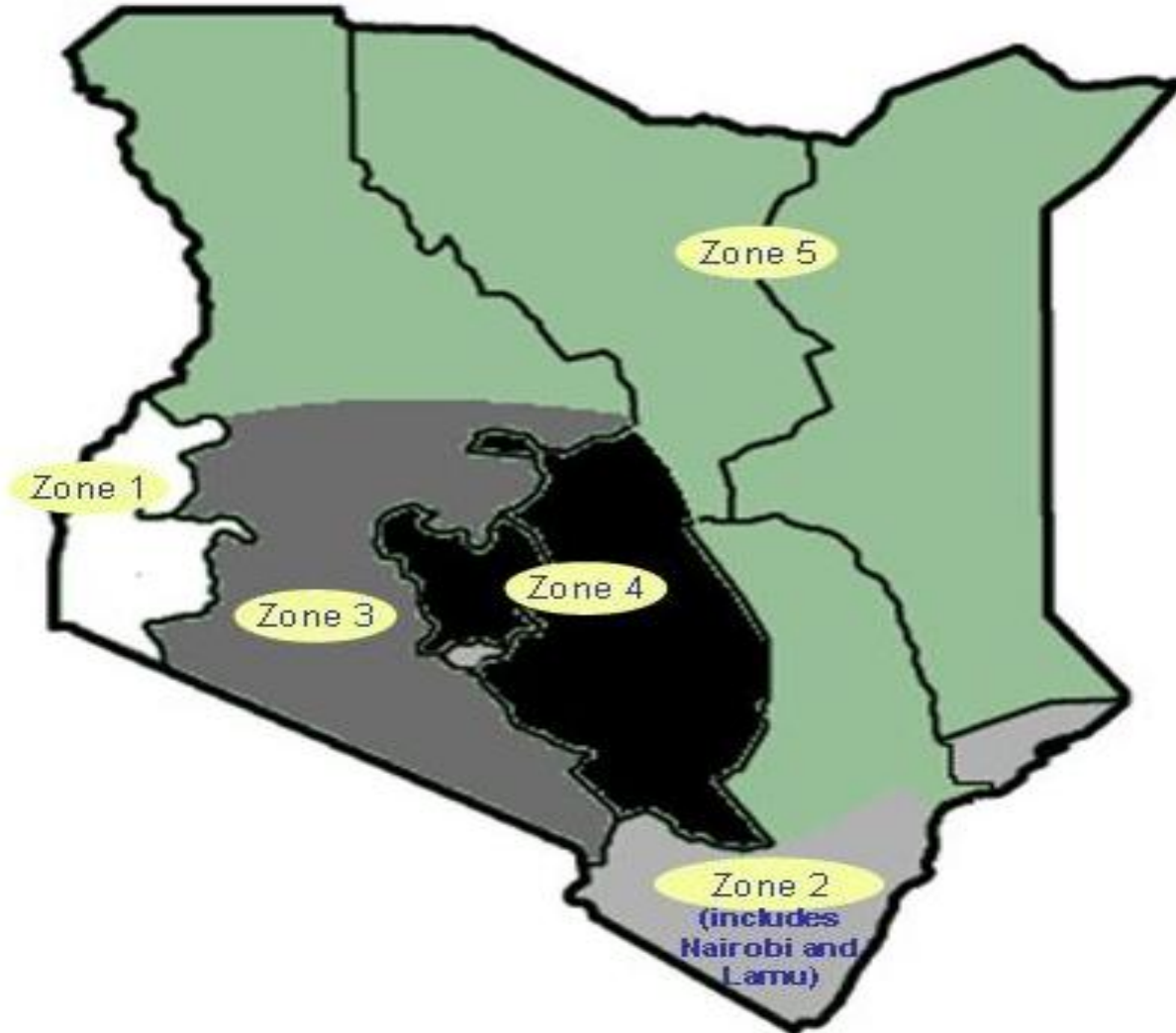

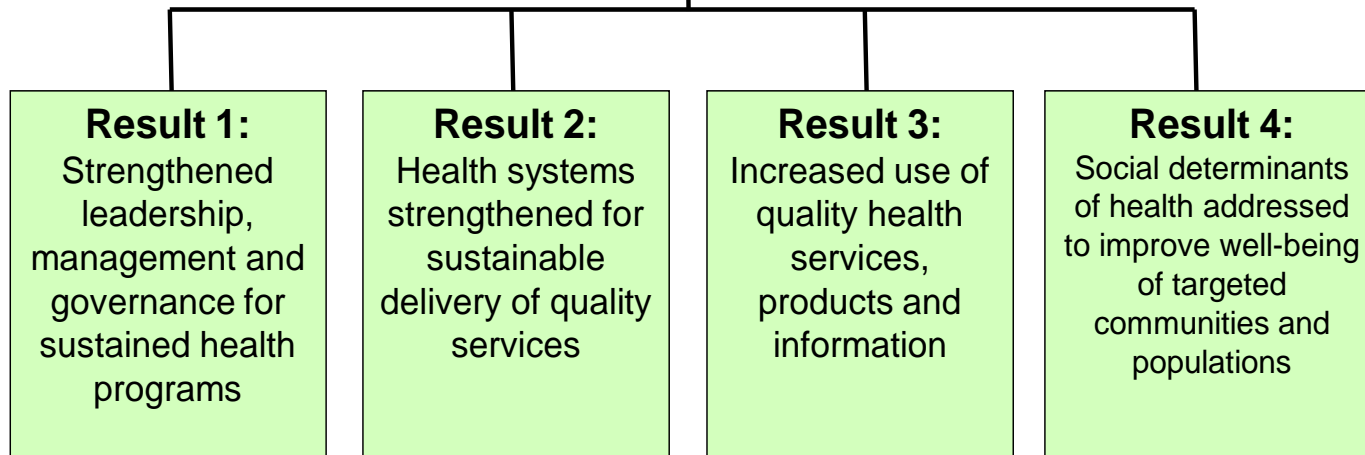
APHIAPlus

- approval of Alcohol and substance abuse
- Attitude towards condoms
- Knowledge of RH/HIV/STIs
- Life skills for decision making, negotiation and self esteem
- Resignation to fate
- Lack of meaningful engagement of young pple
- Intergenerational sexual relationship
- Negative service provider attitude
- High Religiosity
- Lack of YFRH services

Behavior

•Delayed onset of sexual debut

Reduced uptake of drugs and alcohol

•Increased Early Rx for TB, STI, Malaria, etc

•Reduces number of multiple and concurrent sexual partners

•Increased proper use of FP including Condoms
